### PASTORAL LETTER

#### The Spirit of God

We believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son, who with the Father and the Son is worshiped and glorified, Nicene Creed

The Holy Spirit is not am impersonal force to be employed when needed for a little extra energy! The Holy Spirit is the personal presence of God, to whom we Such a relief! Such liberty! When one gives up all are to be given and yielded, and with whom we are to authority to Christ, that one is liftbe filled.

As Jesus is the objective revelation of God to us, so the Spirit is the subjective presence of God who constantly applies the grace of God to our lives.

The Heidelberg Catechism explains: *Q53*. *What do* you believe concerning "the Holy Spirit"? First, that the Spirit, with the Father and the Son, is eternal God. Second, that the Spirit is given also to me, so that, through true faith, he makes me share in Christ and all his benefits, comforts me, and will remain with me forever.

The Holy Spirit creates the Church, and makes it both Holy and catholic/universal. It is the Spirit that calls people into communion with Christ, makes us members of His Body, sets us apart as sacred to God, and overcomes all barriers that divide us one from another.

The eternal and unassailable relationship that we have with each other, in Christ, forever, is the creation and gift of the Spirit of God.

The Spirit convicts us of our sin, and assures of pardon. The Spirit applies the forgiveness merited by Christ, and enables us both to receive forgiveness for ourselves, and to forgive others.

It is the Spirit of God who assures us of eternal life, who raised our Lord Jesus from the dead, and who will raise us with him. As the Heidelberg Catechism, Q 1, phrases it, "By his Holy Spirit, He also assures me of eternal life, and makes me wholeheartedly ready and willing, from now on, to live for Him."

We do have a choice, however, in how we respond to the Spirit of God. Many of us choose to rely upon ourselves for guidance and strength.

We have the infinite riches of God's Spirit to the extent we are yielded and open. But we often choose to live like spiritual paupers! We are commanded to "Be filled with the Spirit," which is, essentially to allow Jesus to be Lord—and so to rely upon His Spirit to govern and guide.

This entails a simple exercise of Spiritual breathing: 1. Exhale: "Loving God forgive me for my self-will and stubborn resistance to your Holy Spirit. & 2. Inhale: "Fill me with your Holy Spirit as I yield completely to Jesus as my Lord."

#### THE "CANON" OF THE BIBLE




Starting May 8, we continue our journey in the Bible, learning how all these gospels and letters were put together—why the four gospels of Matthew,

#### Pastor GREETINGS FROM Search YOUR PNC!

Happy Spring, everyone! As the seasons begin their shift into spring and on to summer, so too is the PNC transitioning into a new phase, and I feel this is good time to update you all on what we've been doing, where we are now, and what's coming up.

Since my last article we have been very busy reading PIF's from potential candidates:

- 49 total PIF's received as of 4/20/16
- 18 PIF's were matches through the Church Leadership Connection
- 31 PIF's were self-referred
- 11 PIF's selected for further review
- We contacted each of these candidates for confirmation of their continued interest in Trinity

Since Easter, the PNC has been busy re-evaluating these candidates through review and discussion of their submitted materials, viewing sermons and thoughtful prayer. We are very excited to have identified a handful of candidates who we feel really resonate with Trinity's needs as well as wants. Our hope is to begin some initial conversations with these individuals in mid-May. We are looking forward to

learning more about each of these candidates and are extremely hopeful for good and inspired conversations.

Please continue to keep the PNC, potential candidates, and Trinity itself, in your prayers as we embark on yet another step in this process.

## **SESSION NOTES**

Session Notes from April 19, 2016

After Leone Mohney opened our meeting with prayer, and the docket and consent agenda were adopted, Session members engaged with Jerry Foust to discuss more about the Bowen Theory. Having a solid set of principles and maintaining the integrity of those principles under stress are components of a good leader. Elders explored ways to diffuse contentious discussions and angry conversations.

Reports were received and Session made a few decisions. After being examined, Cindy Toering was received into leadership as an elder. Hopefully, her installation will happen on May 1, 2016. Another decision made was to change the June stated session meeting to June 28, 2016 in order to avoid a conflict with Vacation Bible School.

The biggest decision Session made was to ask our Developers (Paulus-Dorman-Bourn) for a Definitive Agreement that contains all the terms and conditions necessary to make our project go forward including the sum of \$100,000 placed in escrow on or before December 31, 2016. Without the agreement and the deposit of money, all previous signed Letters of Intent will be null and void and Trinity will be free to market our property to other interested parties. Session approved this action.

For Christian Education, Matt Kreamer outlined his preparations for Vacation Bible School and discussed ways that congregants can help with the children who attend. Daphne Madson said that the Deacons delivered lilies to the homebound and that they will have an April Retreat at Lodge on the Desert. Deacons are reviewing the 23 persons on the Trinity Inactive Rolls in preparation to eliminate that roll.

Alice Smedley reported for the Mission Committee saying that the March 4th on 4th Community Supper was a special one. Our sponsored refugee family is thriving and the Resource Center helped 40 clients in March.

The Pastor Nominating Committee is preparing to interview potential candidates for our pastor in May. So far, PNC has reviewed around 50 Pastor Information Forms.

Lynn Moser told session members about sanitary gloves being worn for Intinction and that a choir intern is planned for the 2016-17 choir season. Volunteer Recognition Sunday planned for May 8, 2016 was discussed.

Administration & Personnel Committee is reviewing Presbytery de Cristo's "Policy & Procedures on Child Protection & Sexual Misconduct Prevention" and making adaptations for Trinity PC.

Growth & Outreach Team reported polo shirts arrived and that the NPR ads for the Easter service were successful. Carolyn Maycher told Session that the Property Committee is contracting for parking lot improvements in the near future.

Ann Walker and Bill Voigt informed Session that our JP Morgan Trust investment portfolio contained interest that the account managers should have forwarded to Trinity for 2015. Stewardship & Finance Committee have received this check. This should ease our finances.

Session prayed for several congregants and asked that we be filled with God's grace and compassion
