PASTORAL LETTER



Ash Wednesday is February 14th, which begins the season of Lent and the six Sundays leading to Holy Week. Each year I teach a Lenten-themed six-week class which begins on the first Sunday of Lent and continues through Palm Sunday. This year I am teaching a class I have developed called "The Six Mountains of Jesus." My source book was written in 1985 by Terence Donaldson titled "Jesus On The Mountain." The book is out of print and unavailable, but it will not be necessary for the class. Here are the topics for each Sunday:

Feb. 18 – "The Mountain of Temptation"
Feb. 25 – "The Mountain of Teaching"
March 3 – "The Mountain of Feeding"
March 10 – "The Mountain of Transfiguration"
March 17 – "The Mount of Olives"
March 24 (Palm Sunday) – "The Mountain of

Commissioning"

All classes are sourced in Matthew's gospel. I will be making the scripture passages available each Sunday, but you are also welcome to bring your favorite Bible. The classes will be held in the Upper Room on the third floor of the Sanctuary building (near Fellowship Hall.) Classes will begin at 9am and end at 9:50. Because we will not be using a copyrighted video for teaching, I will be recording the classes and placing them on our website each week.

The class will explore the spiritual theme in Matthew of the mountains from which Jesus performed his ministry and prepared his disciples for his death and resurrection. It will also highlight the two Old Testament mountains that Matthew connects to his gospel – Mt. Sinai, and Mt. Zion (the Temple Mount.) Whether you join us in the classroom or watching

online, it is my prayer that the Lenten Class will be inspirational and informative.

May God bless and keep you in February as we enter the Lenten season and journey with Christ to the cross and the empty tomb.

MISSION NEWS

Trinity's Terry Dalke Social Services Center was VERY busy in 2023! The Food Pantry distributed food boxes to 35 families each month (190 people in those families). There were between 30 and 70 walkins daily. Dedicated volunteers gave nutritious snack bags to each walk-in. Some got beanies, socks, gloves, flip flops or toiletries. On March 5, the Food Pantry had an Open House to show off the Pantry as it is, now, in the main building. The congregation had the opportunity to visit after worship. Trinity's Women raffled three quilts with the proceeds going to our Food Pantry. Just Coffee sales continued and the profit from the sales was sent back to Frontera de Cristo. Casa Maria Soup Kitchen benefited from hundreds of bologna sandwiches that Trinity provides monthly with our sandwich making after the worship service. With the tragic loss of our Mission Facilitator, Trinity no longer is a DES site for Medicaid and Food Stamps. Before we closed in November, we had helped more than 100 applicants receive Food Stamps and AHCCCS in 2023. We helped more than 200 people receive birth certificates and duplicate ID's in 2023. That service has been discontinued as we found other non-profits and state agencies can make that service available. The Mission Committee helped Admin & Personnel write a job description for a replacement for DeDe Markin. The search is on for a Mission Food Facilitator. Mission Offerings in 2023 went to the Presbyterian Disaster Relief Fund for Lahaina, to the Douglas church after a fire, to the Gilbert Lopez LGBTQ program on 4th Ave through Southern Arizona Aids Foundation, to Rev Elmarie Parker (PCUSA's Mission Partner in Lebanon) who oversees a network of Christian Non-Profits in the Middle East, to the Southern Arizona Community Food Bank, to Frontera de Cristo, to One Great Hour of Sharing and to the Presbytery de Cristo's eight Mission Partners. Thank you to the congregation for their in-kind contributions to the Food Pantry as well as monetary help. The need continues to grow. We get additional help from the Midwest Food Bank, from Grocery Rescue (Trader Joe's) and the Agency Market through the Southern Arizona Community Food Bank. It Thank you to the wonderful team of volunteers who selflessly give of their time and energy to commit to our motto: Serving God in the Heart of the City! Here is an email that the church office received in May, 2023, from a family that came to our Pantry:

Dear Trinity, I can't thank you enough for your generosity. My family needed a food box this month, and you were all so kind and non-judgmental. The items are beyond my wildest expectations and we are just so grateful. Please know how much of an impact you are making for the community and you are very much appreciated $\heartsuit\Box$

Here are the highlights of the January meeting most of which are routine, but are necessary for good and decent order:

- ♦ Session approved Janet Hooper as Clerk of Session and Ruth Russell as Treasurer for 2024.
- ♦ Committee members have been shuffled and, for now, current assignments are as follows: Administration & Personnel has Roberta Westergaard, Chair, and Liz Strong; Christian Education has John Hill, Chair, and Barbara Callaway Pollack; Growth & Outreach has Tom Roof, Chair; Mission has Steve Barlow, Chair; Property has Chuck Sosna, Chair, and Al Coffin; Stewardship & Finance has Ruth Russell, Chair, and Elliott Koeppen; Worship has Janet Jones, Chair, and Janet Hooper.
- ♦ Session elected John Hill, Carolyn Maycher as Presbytery de Cristo Commissioners with Billie Holbrook as an alternate.
- ♦ Elders that will serve on the Congregational Nominating Committee will be Liz Strong and Janet Hooper.
- ♦ Session learned that our membership total stands at 155 members.
- ♦ The Annual Congregational meeting is set for February 11, 2024.
- ♦ The Deacons have met and elected Daphne Madson as Moderator, Cheyenne Williams as Vice-Moderator and Kathy Moser as Secretary. Jim Slagle will serve on the Congregational Nominating Committee.
- ◆ Dr. Mack's Terms of Call will be presented at the February 11th Congregational meeting and includes a 3.2% salary increase for medical supplement and for professional expenses reimbursement.

- ◆ Growth & Outreach Team will begin having monthly birthday and anniversary celebrations after worship.
- ♦ Mission Committee has approved Just Coffee profits of \$350 to be given to Frontera de Cristo. They have discontinued giving out ID vouchers at the Food Bank site. They approved the February special offering to go to the Deacon Emergency Assistance Fund.
- ♦ Stewardship & Finance approved canceling the credit card assigned to DeDe Markin.
- ♦ Worship Committee is planning Lenten events beginning with an Ash Wednesday soup supper and ending with a 6:30 am Easter sunrise service and 10:30 am Cantata.
- ♦ Session's prayer is to have the Holy Spirit's guidance in the coming year as we address the challenges ahead.
