PASTORAL LETTER

Did 2025 move by quickly or slowly for you? It seems the older I get, the quicker the years go by, but I know this is not reality – just perspective. There are always 24 hours in one day, 7 days in one week, and 365 days in one year, except for Leap Year. As we begin a new year, we always speculate about the things that are to come, both from a personal and collective point-of-view, but our perspective makes a difference. I've been re-reading "Lost Moon" by Astronaut Jim Lovell. When the Apollo 13 disaster occurred in the 1960's, you might recall that Lovell was forced to navigate his ship by hand, because the guidance system could not be powered up. Lovell knew that all he needed to do was find a fixed point in space in order to correct the ship's approach to earth, so he used the earth itself, and aligned it with the navigation marks in his window. Through skill and a little luck, Lovell's correction aligned the spacecraft into the correct position for re-entry, and the astronauts made it home.

For we who believe, Christ is our fixed point in space. By focusing our hearts, our minds, and our lives upon Jesus, we can find our way home, no matter how we perceive the universe around us. Time can rush by quickly or slowly; changes occur through our own plans or by happenstance; what seems solid and sure one minute can become shaky and frightening the next- this is the nature of the world and of the human condition. For Christians, however, there is one thing that is absolutely certain - the kingdom of God. We experience God's kingdom when we suspend time and space through acts of prayer, worship, inspiration and illumination. In Christ, past, present and future lose their meaning, for God the Father, the Son, and the Spirit is the Alpha and the Omega.

To look forward to the new year with hope and expectation is natural for us, but beyond our resolution and wishes for 2026 is that which cannot leave us, fail us, or disappoint us - it is the assurance of Christ's presence in our lives today and in the life to

come. Christians are not those who tick off the days of a calendar that ends when our hearts stop beating; we are, instead, residents of a kingdom, and servants of a sovereign whose reign never ends. We live in and for a different reality, and that is why, in faith, we can say with blessed assurance that the new year will be a good year - not because of what may or may not happen to us, but because God is always good, and no matter how fast or slow time goes by, we are moving with and toward our Lord and Savior. The Son of God is always our fixed point in our hearts, and it is toward him we are always moving. He alone will bring us home. Have a wonderful New Year, and a meaningful 2026, filled with the inner peace of our Lord Jesus Christ.

TRINITY FOOD PANTRY

Trinity's Food Pantry is open **Tuesday and Thursday from 12:00 to 3:00 pm** in basement of the Sanctuary building. Thanks for your food and monetary donations.

Food Pantry Needs Check the table in the Narthex for ideas. Canned vegetables, protein or granola bars, bread, tuna or other canned protein and peanut butter are needed. Donations may be brought to church on Sunday & the office Monday through Thursday 10:00 am to 3:00 pm. Sign up to volunteer at trinitytucson.org/volunteer.

Food Pantry Numbers In December 596 people in 279 households received 284 Food Bank Boxes through our Food Pantry with 45 return pantry visits. There were 402 Walk-ins - an average of 50/day.

Trinity's Food Pantry is connected with Grocery Rescue (part of Feeding America). We are always looking for volunteers to help with unloading and storing a delivery of food on Monday mornings at 9:30 in Trinity's south parking lot. We unload in Trinity Hall and sort, document, weigh, store and toss spoiled items. The Southern Arizona Community Food Bank has connected our pantry with the Walmart Neighborhood Market at Grant & Alvernon and we are committed to every Monday holidays included! Kids are welcome to help during school holidays and breaks. It's fun to see the different items we receive and the abundance of it. Come to the south parking lot Mondays at 9:30 and help. I'll have the Pantry Gate open! Wear a hat! We'll have gloves and water. Drivers are also needed to pick up at Walmart, contact Peter or Billie if you are interested in doing that.

Just Coffee (Café Justo) Update January 2026

Eileen Lamse says: "It may be some time before we receive additional shipments of Just Coffee to sell. Café Justo has had a number of challenges in their operations in 2025 including a supply shortage of coffee beans, pricing adjustments needed due to the increased cost of the beans and processing & "a landscape of uncertainty about import/export requirements & tariffs." They are working with Frontera de Cristo to stabilize their operations in 2026 and are hoping to start processing coffee once the next coffee harvest is completed in February. They plan to raise prices somewhat, and the size of the coffee packages will be reduced from a 1 pound size to a ¾ pound size. We will keep current on what is happening and place an order for new coffee as soon as they are operational again." There is some coffee for sale in Fellowship Hall near the stained glass for \$10 each (cash or check).

Trinity Presbyterian Women completed 80 teddy bears for the year of 2025. 37 caps and 9 lap quilts were also completed. Many hands were used to make all these items. Fabric was donated for the bears by Marilyn Slagle, Janet Hooper and Helen Greer. Liz Barlow, Nancy Hamadou, Billie Holbrook, Rose Emery, Harriet Marble, Karen Sims, Ruth Russell, Ida Wickizer and Ruth Myers have worked to cut the bears out, stick, stuff, embroider and stitch them shut after stuffing. Janet Jones helped with sewing machine work. Catherine Dimenstein and Charity Everitt have crocheted caps. Mary Wong contributed fabric well before she died for quilts. Bonnie Stull cut blocks from the fabric and stitched them into quilt tops. Ruth Myers machine quilted them.

Debbie Hobbs and Bonnie Stull delivered the bears, caps and lap sized quilts the day after they were blessed by Rev. Dr. Mack Sigmon to Arizona Children's Association, Gospel Rescue Mission, Primavera & Our Family Social Service Agency. These are all organizations that serve families with children. It takes a church to accomplish this task. From 2020 through 2025 488 bears, 157 caps and 30 lap quilts have been created and gifted to these organizations.

They also sponsor an All-Church picnic at Reid Park. After their report Dr. Mack summarized many of the activities of the elders during the past year.

Retiring deacons are Jim and Marilyn Slagle and Emmanuel Alley. The next Class of deacons includes Kathy Moser, Emalie Wilka Scott, Celeste Dzapka and Charity Everitt. After the dinner and meeting the deacons and elders hold their separate meetings. Here are the highlights of the Session meeting:

- Since none of the committees had met yet Session voted to bypass committee reports, pass the consent agenda and discuss the 2026 budget.
- The Annual Congregational meeting is scheduled for February 8, 2026.
- Committee reports need to be submitted to Sheila Croteau by January 15, 2026 so she can construct and print the overall report to the congregation.
- Worship Committee has approval to serve communion on the first Sunday of each month in 2026.
- Trinity Presbytery Women produced 80

- Mack announced that he has been tapped to serve on the Presbytery de Cristo Committee on Ministry once again.
- Sonic, the service dog in training, is better behaved during Session meetings than any of the elders, or Mack. This is a test to see if anyone reads Session Notes.
- Session approved the 2026 budget. This is a big deal. Stewardship & Finance Committee and Treasurer Eileen Lamse worked with each committee to trim expenses and be creative about savings.
- It is heartwarming that pledging for 2026 has increased over pledging for 2025.
- Eileen Lamse says that our investment funds did very well in 2025. Pray that continues.
- Session approved beginning a new line item in our budget called the Senior Emergency Relief Fund (Harriet Marsh Fund). This is being created with the blessing of the Mission Committee. It is designed to help our former Commissioned Lay Pastor Dr. Harriet Marsh and others who outlive their retirement preparations. A few deacons and good friends are involved in helping Harriet navigate the future. Look and listen for more details about how you can help.
