OUR MISSION: SERVING GOD'S WORLD

MISSION COMMITTEE

- ⇒ 4th on 4th Community Suppers provided hot meals in a warm and friendly atmosphere for 50-90 disadvantaged people
- ⇒ Deacon's Emergency Fund helped Trinity families in need ⇒
- ⇒ Homeless Connect used our facilities to provide services at two events in 2018
- ⇒ Second Sunday each month, now called Mission Sunday, has the congregation making about 600 sandwiches for Casa Maria and putting together water bottles & protein bars for Trinity's Food Pantry
- ⇒ Weekly breakfasts are provided for 100 men staying in the Primavera homeless shelter
- ⇒ Gumbo was provided for the Primavera Men's shelter monthly
- ⇒ Trinity participated in the Crop Walk in October for Church World Service's hunger needs globally and locally
- ⇒ Trinity's Food Bank/Pantry serves those in hunger three times weekly

- ⇒ Terry J Dalke Resource Center helped clients sign up for Food Stamps and medical care, get bus money, replace lost ID's and other services necessary to fill basic needs
- ⇒ Cup of Water distributed water to passers-by at the 4th Ave Street Fairs
- ⇒ Christmas Cantina collected money and items for the asylum program
- Mission giving also went to Frontera de Cristo, Middle Eastern Fellowship, Primavera, Casa Maria Sandwiches, Interfaith Community Service and Presbyterian Campus Ministry.
- ⇒ Many Trinity members helped Amos Nsenga's refugee family by tutoring the children, giving driving lessons and transportation to schools, dentists and doctors.
- ⇒ Provisions were made for a new ministry to assist those accepted to seek asylum by providing a short term shelter and assisting in getting them to their sponsors.

OUR MISSION RESOURCES

PROPERTY

2018 was an eventful year for the Property Committee. Our activities tended to fall into one of three categories.

First, there were all the "day-to-day" emergencies associated with keeping our older facility operating. Keeping the HVAC system operating in a climate with extreme temperatures was accomplished through the efforts of Peter Holbrook. The Committee made a significant commitment in working with staff in prioritizing crisis events with planned activities.

Secondly, significant projects included Fellowship Hall improvements (flooring, HVAC), access ramps to the south parking lot, and coordination with the new construction. Upgrades to the memorial gardens were made responsive to several members of the congregation.

Lastly, the Committee completed prioritization of important projects. This included preliminary estimates and scope, as well as programming, dependent on funding. This effort resulted in a priority list, which reflects thoughtful consideration by staff and Committee members.

LONG RANGE DEVELOPMENT TEAM

Construction has started on Phase 1 and is on schedule for a Fall 2019 completion.

- In November the committee initiated performance review of all staffers and pastors. The pastors met with staffers and documented their discussions; the committee met with the two pastors both of which provided documentation of their activities throughout the year.




