PASTORAL LETTER

Watching the desert transform from the brown and red colors of an arid land to the lush green of monsoon never ceases to amaze me. Even six years later I am still astounded at how little I understood about the American Southwest, and how much I am still learning every day. Is it not true that we really cannot understand a place, a culture, or a people until we live in it – until we allow it to permeate our lives? How much of this world dwells under our misconceptions, simply because we are closed off to the possibility that it might be more than we can imagine.

When I served in Zaire, Africa as a Peace Corps volunteer, I did not know what to expect. I knew that the images of Africa and the peoples of Africa as depicted in films and stories were probably not accurate, but once again I was amazed at how the culture was beyond anything I had imagined. While it was true that I was living in a third-world nation that was extremely poor, I experienced a people who were more joyful about living life than any I had ever known. I discovered a community that lived in the full meaning of that word.

When I began to experience life on the Diné reservation through the eyes of the friends that I made through our Presbyterian connections, I discovered a deep love for this land that moved far beyond history and encompassed the spirit of a people. When I was growing up, my father took us on a vacation to Washington, DC, Pennsylvania, and Virginia. It was a journey dedicated to the history of the United States, encompassing the significant places and people that I had read about in school. When my Diné friend took his son on vacation, they went to landmarks and sights that had deep meaning to Diné history - Bears Ears monument, the Grand Canyon Skywalk, Monument Valley and the Four Corners. I have visited some of these places and enjoyed their beauty, but I realized that I could never have the kind of feeling for the land that my Dine friend expressed to me.

When we talk about the Kingdom of Heaven, we are talking about a spiritual landscape that we walk through in this world. It takes an understanding of the story of Christ to appreciate the Kingdom of which he spoke, but it also takes a deep emotional connection that we share through our Christian faith. If my Christian African friends, my Christian Diné friends, and myself have any kind of life that we share completely, it is the spiritual life of the Kingdom of Heaven. The Kingdom speaks a language that transcends words with the language of Christ's love – that which he called "agape." That is the language that all believers speak. It is a language that is without the boundaries of both space and time; it is language that connects us to the heart of God and in so doing, connects us to each other.

When was the last time we allowed the Kingdom of God to amaze us? It will do so everyday, and for eternity, if we live in it and immerse ourselves into that life. September of 2022 is another month, filled with days and hours to do just that. The Kingdom of God is our land – a land we explore through the eyes of faith and the love of Jesus Christ. May we do just that as we continue our journey in the eternal love of God.

Maintenance and Future Projects for Trinity

Greetings all, I was asked by the Stewardship and Finance Committee to clue you in on how much we have spent year to date on maintaining our wonderful facility that we all love! Year to date maintenance and repairs expenses total \$30,759.97. Thanks to some bequests we have gotten between the end of 2021 and the beginning of 2022 we've been able to make some major repairs and updates to the Sanctuary Building. Here are some of the repairs and refreshing that we did. (Expenses came out of Capital Maintenance Reserve for these projects.)

- New Mini Split A/C Unit for the Bell Room.
- New LED Lighting around the outside of the Sanctuary Building.
- Repaired and Coated the Sanctuary Roof and Bell Tower areas.
- Made necessary repairs to the Mechanical Room located below the south east corner of the Fellowship Hall.
- Coated roof and repaired wall above mechanical room where A/C Units are.
- Sealed cracks in south ramp that leads to the lower level from Celebration Park.

Approximately \$10,000.00 of that total has been spent on preventative maintenance and minor repairs around the entire facility. These expenses came out of the Property Budget under Church Repairs Line Item. Approximate cost per year in maintenance - \$25,000-\$30,000.

Future Projects Listed in Order of Prioritization

- New Air Handler installed in Trinity Hall. \$30,000-\$40,000- there is currently no air conditioning there.
- Repair Chancel Floor in Sanctuary. To Be Determined by Property and Worship Committees as part of a larger project.
- New Air Handler for West side of Sanctuary. Located above sound room. \$20,000
- Digital Sound System Upgrade for Sanctuary. To Be Determined
- New LED Lighting for Sanctuary, Narthex and Fellowship Hall areas. \$10,000, but also part
 of a larger project between Property and Worship Committees
- Possible Trinity Hall Kitchen Updating to make Health Dept. Certified. \$50,000 at the most.

Maintaining and updating the Sanctuary Building needs constant strategic planning.


