PASTORAL LETTER

Have you finished your Christmas shopping yet? Have you decorated for Christmas? Probably all of us if we were asked that question would answer "no" – although I must express some envy for those whose Christmas decorations are already in place, since I always wait until the last few days. As silly a question as this might sound, you can bet that the week after Halloween, all the major retail outlets will be stocking their shelves with Christmas items and decorating their stores. In the retail world, there is a narrow window between Halloween and the New Year to boost their Christmas sales, and for some retailers 75% or more of their annual sales are made from November to December. Their urgency to sell may not match our urgency to buy, but they know that the viability of their businesses depends on their being ready when the urge to buy begins.

Are there narrow windows of time in the framework of life itself? Jesus thought so, and he urged his followers to act urgently. Much of that urgency has been related to the second coming of Christ in most of Christianity, but I think Jesus was talking about an urgency of faith more related to the needs of others rather than just our preparation for the apocallypse. Can you think of any urgent needs in our world at this moment. If we live our lives with a Christian conscience, we will see those urgent needs all around us.

Perhaps there is someone who needs our forgiveness today, or someone we urgently need to ask for pardon. Certainly, there are those who need our help right now, while we have the breath of life in us. Someone needs our prayers right now. Someone needs food because they or their loved ones are hungry. There is a loneliness in someone that needs to be touched by the love that Christ taught us to share, someone who needs just a phone call, or a card, or a visit. A smile and a" God bless you," – even to strangers – can work wonders. A teacher could use a "thank you" right now – is that so hard to do? Creation needs help right now, including

God's creatures, and there are so many ways, great and small, that we can care for this planet and its abundant life that God has given us.

Of course, we are not perfect, and we do not do these things perfectly and sometimes not timely – but if we just do them, even sporadically, they glorify the kingdom of God. I think Christ wanted to give us a sense of urgency because our opportunities to do discipleship change as our lives change. And I also believe that Christ did not want anyone to suffer one minute more than was necessary in a fallen world. That is why Jesus taught us to perform our discipleship with urgency – not from a sense of fear, but from love.

Have you ever noticed that when you urgently need something, time slows down to a crawl? Have you ever sat in an emergency room waiting to be helped? Have you ever found yourself at the side of the road waiting for a wrecker to come? Have you ever waited for a check to arrive to help resolve a debt? We need to remember those times, and then think about who we can help those for whom time is crawling because of their desperation..

I doubt many of us have started our Christmas shopping, but as the season approaches, it will start taking priority over other things. The need of our sisters and brothers in this world – those for whom the Son of God died – is already and here and waiting for someone who will respond with love. May it be us, every day. Have a wonderful October.

Both these groups will be held in <u>Room 1</u> led by Debbie Hobbs and Bonnie Stull, with the assistance of other adults. They will meet children/youth at the back of the sanctuary after the children's message.

SESSION NOTES

September's Stated Session meeting was uneventful. All discussion and business took around 47 minutes – a new record! Who said Presbyterians only know how to have lengthy meetings? New committee reporting comes from the Nominating Committee who began their work on September 11, 2022. They are looking for elders & deacons for the Classes of 2025. Please consider a leadership position to help lead our church in the post-pandemic world of hybrid meetings and protocols to keep our community vibrant and safe. Here are the highlights of September Session business:

- The Deacons are rescheduling their planned class to learn about AEDs and CPR from October to January. They are working with the Worship Committee about how to handle the collection and dedication of offerings and gifts during worship.
- Our Presbytery Commissioners reported excitement about the August 27, 2022 Big Event with the Grand Canyon and de Cristo Presbyteries.
 Over 200 people were able to participate online and in person using Zoom and hub sites to include remote churches in both Presbyteries. Our Commissioners highly recommend that everyone read "Everywhere You Look: Discovering the Church Right Where You Are" by Tim Soerens.
- Administration & Personnel Committee ask that we pray for the continuing health of our bookkeeper Gerry Pearson who has had serious illness but is recovering and will continue with her work for Trinity PC.
- Growth & Outreach Team has overseen labelling the historic photos in the narthex and is updating the photos of our past and present pastors in the hallway opposite the Nursery.
- The Long Range Development Team confirms the November 1, 2022 closing on the Phase II property (old Education Wing).
- Mission Committee reports high numbers using our Food Bank site, 900 sandwiches made for Casa Maria and a busy Resource Center. The August Special Mission offering resulted in \$1,740 given to Compañeros en Misión.
- Property Committee received approval to use \$2,968 from the Memorial Fund to replace the

- blower in the Chapel organ. They are working to find space in the Sanctuary building for our mission activities and for some of our current tenants in the old education building. The AC in Trinity Hall will be fixed because of a generous \$33,000 anonymous gift.
- Stewardship & Finance Committee is finalizing the events scheduled for the weekend that Presbyterian Foundation representative Maggie Harmon comes to preach and conduct a workshop. Look for details and sign up to attend.
- Worship Committee has many irons in the fire as Advent approaches. There will be a Greening Service on November 27th. All Saints Sunday is November 6th. Some new intern faces will show up in the bass section of the choir. New banners, flowers, garlands and bows may be coming soon.
- During Session "Leading Together" time Dr. Mack encouraged all of us to think about a new way to communicate our beliefs as reformed Christians in a world where the church will never be the same after the pandemic and others are defining what being a Christian means.
- Session members prayed for those in our congregation with special need for extra care and concern.


